### 1. Introduction

To introduce the paper, if necessary, insert nomenclature in a box with the same font size as the rest of the document. The paragraphs proceed from here and are divided by headings, subheadings, pictures, and formulae only. Also, do use English (United Kingdom) only for the reference and citation style according to APA 6<sup>th</sup> edition. Please ensure that at least 30% of the list references consists of papers from the last five years back.

#### 1.1 Structure (Heading 2)

The documents should only be in MS Word. It should be prepared for direct printing format by using the given CRC MS Word. Figures and tables should be inserted and not separately given.

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Arabic numerals should be numbered on all tables. Every table must have a description explaining the table of contents. The headings should be placed above tables, justified on the left. Within a table, only horizontal lines should be used to distinguish the headings of the column from the table body, and immediately above and below the table. Tables must be embedded into the text and not supplied separately. Table 1 is an example that might be helpful to the authors.

## 1.2 Structure of References

You must list the references at the end of the manuscript. Unless this is required, do not start them on a new page. Reference should follow the standard of an APA 6th edition and must be specified in alphabetical order, font 10, and not bold (reference styles). Authors will make sure that each reference in the text appears in the reference list, and vice versa. Specify references in the text by (Richard, Harold, & Lipton, 2018), or (Steve & Whitney, 2020).

Few examples of how you should list your references are given in the 'References' section at the end of this guide, which will help you to compile your reference list according to the appropriate format and font size.

## 1.3 Section Headings

Section headings (Heading 1 style) should be left-justified, bold, capitalized and numbered consecutively with the first letter beginning with the Introduction. Heading 2 style sub-section headings should also be in a similar format as headings, numbered 1.1, 1.2, etc., and left-justified, with second and subsequent lines indented. Before a page or column break, all headings should have a minimum of three text lines after them. Except for the last page, make sure that the text area is not blank. Other level of the subheadings should not bold and in the same style as 1.1.1.

## 1.4 Generic Guidelines

Skip hyphenation at the end of a line. Symbols which denote vectors and matrices should be written in bold form. Names of the scalar variable will usually be shown in italics. Refer to the SI unit when describing weight and measures. Provide with a glossary or specified when first stated for all of non-standard abbreviations or symbols.

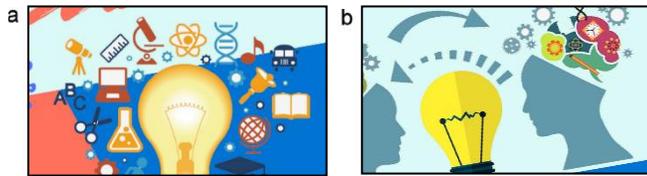
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**Fig. 1: (a) first picture; (b) second picture.**

## 3. Equations

Equations and formulae need to in Mathtype format and numbered consecutively in parentheses with Arabic numerals on the right side of the page (if explicitly mentioned in the text). A single space must separate it even from the surrounding text.

Acknowledgements, Appendix and Reference heading (Acknowledgement style) should be left-justified, font 10, bold, with a capitalization of the first letter but without numbers. Subsequent text continues as the standard form.
